


















Brett Amory

Brett Amory was born in 1975 in Chesapeake, Virginia. Relocating to San Francisco in 1994. In which Amory lived in the San Francisco's famed Tenderloin neighborhood for 15 years, altering his societal outlook and ultimately affecting his decision to become an artist. In 2009 he relocated to Oakland, California, he now calls Oakland his home.

Amory is most known for his Waiting series, which began in 2001. Interested in the ordinary, and inspired by his photographs of San Francisco's city architecture and the people he observed—seemingly always in a state of waiting. Amory on Waiting "I feel especially drawn to individuals who look lost, lonely, or awkward—those who don't appear to fit into local societal norms."

The Waiting series illustrates how people are distracted by a constant internal dialogue, preoccupation with memories of the past and concerns for the future. Amory's work attempts to visually represent the concept of detachment and anticipation, conveying the many ideas associated with individual moments of our daily lives. From Waiting Amory would tackle other challenging and big picture topics, exploring the unromantic, unexplored and forgotten side of cities across the United States and Great Britain.

Lucien Shapiro

Lucien Shapiro was born in 1979, in Santa Rosa, CA. He attended San Francisco Academy of Art University and received a BFA in 2003. It was here where Shapiro became addicted to the process of painstaking repetition and meticulous attention to craft.

Shortly after his time at school, Shapiro developed a practice he calls "**Urban Obsessions**", which explores both artist's and viewer's perception of identity, addiction, time, and loss. He composes elaborately constructed masks and ornately armored weaponry and vessels, which examines a relationship between modern waste and memories of ancient cultural artifacts. Practices and customs from the past are brought back to light through his revival of discarded materials, transformed into objects analogous with self-protection. A laborious craft and meditative consumption of time, transforms forgotten objects into nostalgically interesting and beautiful relics that compel viewers to re-evaluate what our everyday possessions represent and mean to us.

Shapiro's work was included in the December 2013 issue of Juxtapoz Magazine, and he has shown nationally and internationally. Most recently, the objects he creates are being utilized in various symbolic rituals that are performed and filmed. Recent live stage performances include a 30 plus city world tour entitled "A Fools Journey", Coachella 2015, Kaaboo 2015, and Art Direction behind the GLK Experience video covered by Rolling Stone.

Derek Weisberg

Derek Weisberg was born in 1983, in Santa Rosa CA. At age 7 he began working in ceramics, which was the beginning of his lifelong love and ultimate passion. He unwaveringly pursued ceramics sculpture throughout his childhood and teens, in Benicia, CA, where he was raised. At age 18 he moved to Oakland, CA, to pursue his love for ceramics and art in general and attended California College of Arts and Crafts. It was there that he developed a strong and distinct aesthetic, focusing on emotional and psychological figurative sculpture. The sculptures were not represented like a photo, instead achieved a naturalistic, heartfelt, from the gut sensibility.

Accessibility is key in attempt to express basic human qualities, which

are universal and timeless. At its core the work reflects humanist ideology; searching for truth and universal morality based on the commonality of the human <u>condition</u>.

Weisberg is specifically interested in expressing conditions of longing, loss, dysfunction, fragility, vulnerability and melancholy.

For Weisberg, making art is an attempt to make sense of his own life, experiences, and the times in which he lives. In 2006, when his mother passed away he began to include themes of death, afterlife, spirituality and the metaphysical into the work. Themes of death are explored through expressing life, and the work became a combination and slow digestion of all these dualities and subtleties. In 2011 Weisberg moved to New York, where he currently lives and works.


Shaun Roberts

Shaun Roberts was born in 1979, in Bangkok, Thailand. Born to an American father and Thai mother, Shaun was raised in the urban chaos of Bangkok with a foot in the East & the West. His insatiable curiosity as a child for myriad subjects—ranging from building his own computers to spending countless hours painting in the high-school art room—eventually shaped him into a visual arts polymath.

At age 18 he moved to San Francisco, CA to continue studying digital arts at the Academy of Art University where he pursued his passion in graphic design, typography, printmaking, interaction design, motion graphics, photography, and filmmaking. During his time at AAU he was awarded the Adobe Design Achievement Award at the Solomon R. Guggenheim Museum, NYC for his project "Bay Area Exports". He graduated Valedictorian of his undergraduate class in 2003 with a BFA in New Media.

It was not until after graduating that Shaun discovered his artistic voice. Deeply affected by the passing of his grandfathers (both photographers), Shaun began to explore still photography with renewed fervor. Roberts turned his attention towards documenting the lives and working spaces of artists.

Shaun believes the act of seeing can be an act of compassion, able to ultimately tease out fragments of truth, and elucidating glimpses of the moments of beauty, mystery and dignity of the human experience. The multidisciplinary nature of Shaun's art has lead him to working with leading publications and art institutions.
